Dear Ms. Stevenson:

This letter serves to reiterate the outstanding request for information in the possession of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (hereinafter, the "NCAA") that the NCAA has discovered in the course of its investigation relating to the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill (hereinafter, the "University"). As you are aware, the North Carolina Department of the Secretary of State (hereinafter, the "Department") is investigating athlete agents' acts relating to student-athletes at the University. The Department's objective is to determine whether violations of the Uniform Athlete Agents Act, North Carolina General Statutes Chapter 78C, Article 9, have occurred.

On or about August 19, 2010, representatives of the NCAA and the Department discussed the NCAA's investigation, and representatives of the Department requested information obtained by the NCAA in its investigation. The Department appreciates the information, records, and documents it has received from the NCAA to date.

The Department has reviewed the information, records, and documents received from the NCAA. The Department's review has revealed that the NCAA possesses information, records, and documents that have not been provided to the Department. The Department requires the information, records, and documents that have been withheld by the NCAA in order to complete its investigation properly and thoroughly. For this reason, the Department requests that the NCAA respond to the following requests within seven (7) days of receipt of this letter:

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1. Produce a true, accurate, complete, and unredacted copy of the Notice of Allegations (Case No. M357) that the NCAA provided to the University on or about June 21, 2011 (hereinafter, the "Notice of Allegations");
2. Identify any and all statements made by, or interviews of, University student-athletes, former University student-athletes, University coaches, and University employees relating to the NCAA's investigation and state whether these statements and/or interviews were documented or recorded in any form or manner. Produce to the Department a record of the statement and/or interview as it was documented or recorded, including but not limited to any transcription, writing, or audio recording;
3. Identify any and all statements made by, or interviews of, Todd Stewart relating to the NCAA's investigation and state whether these statements and/or interviews were documented or recorded in any form or manner. Produce to the Department a record of the statement and/or interview as it was documented or recorded, including but not limited to any transcription, writing, or audio recording;
4. Identify any and all statements made by, or interviews of, John Blake relating to the NCAA's investigation and state whether these statements and/or interviews were documented or recorded in any form or manner. Produce to the Department a record of the statement and/or interview as it was documented or recorded, including but not limited to any transcription, writing, or audio recording;
5. Identify any and all statements made by, or interviews of, Marvin Sanders relating to John Blake's contact with Ndamukong Suh and state whether these statements and/or interviews were documented or recorded in any form or manner. Produce to the Department a record of the statement and/or interview as it was documented or recorded, including but not limited to any transcription, writing, or audio recording;
6. Produce a copy of John Blake's July 6, 2010 credit report, referenced in Paragraph 8, subpart (b) of the Notice of Allegations.

The Department requests a true, accurate, complete, and unredacted copy of the Notice of Allegations because the Notice of Allegations alleges athlete agents provided impermissible benefits to student-athletes. The Department requires a complete and unredacted copy of the Notice of Allegations to determine the identity of the student-athletes provided the impermissible benefits. For the same reason, the Department requests records of statements from, or interviews of, student-athletes, former student-athletes, coaches, and employees of the University. The Department

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
requires these records to determine whether violations of the Uniform Athlete Agents Act have occurred.

The Department requests records of statements from, or interviews of, Todd Stewart because the Notice of Allegations alleges Todd Stewart provided impermissible benefits to University student-athletes. The Department requires these records to determine whether violations of the Uniform Athlete Agents Act have occurred.

The Department requests records relating to John Blake because the Notice of Allegations alleges in Paragraph 6 that "John Blake partnered with Gary Wichard, National Football League Players Association (NFLPA) certified agent, and Pro Tect Management to represent individuals in the marketing of their athletic abilities in violation of NCAA legislation" and that "Blake was employed and compensated by Pro Tect Management to influence football student-athletes to hire Wichard to represent them in marketing their athletic abilities and reputations." The Department requires these records to determine whether violations of the Uniform Athlete Agents Act have occurred.

The Department appreciates your assistance and prompt attention to these requests.
